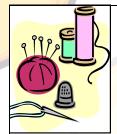

MIKE STANDLEY, BLOCK 4, LOTS 8-13 MADE THE FOLLOWING MOTION:

"I MAKE THE MOTION TO SHUT OFF THE INTIRE PARK NOT JUST THE CAMPERS. THIS INCLUDES ALL STREET LIGHTS, OFFICE, OR ANYTHING ELSE OR LEAVE EVERYTHING AS IS. MIKE STANDLEY, BLOC K 4, LOTS 8-13"

Peggy Schroeder, block 1, lot 4, asked what the amount of money to be saved by shutting the electricity off in the park and Lois Hollerup, block 7, lot 43 asked for it to be put in the newsletter again. (it was in the July issue)

Ron Hollerup, block 7, lot 43 reminded that we are considered a transient park. If the state of Lowa comes in during the time we are closed, (October 15 to April 15) and there are people living here, it will cost us all a lot of money. For the park to be open 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, becoming a year-round park, our water tower would have to be redone for instance.

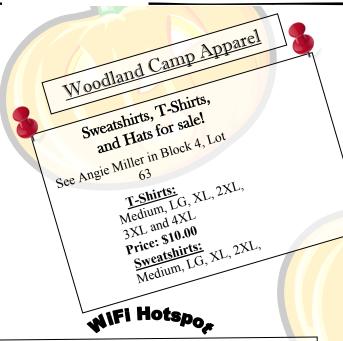
