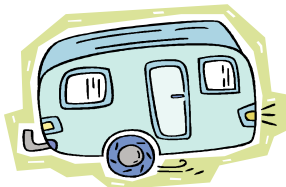

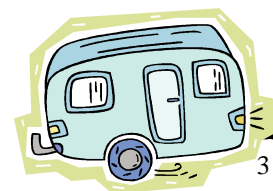

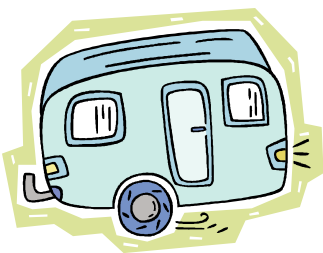

AUDIT REPORT:

- We have rectified 3-4 little things that were suggested such as the amount of petty cash on hand, and now all bills will be stamped paid, just some small suggestions.

There are 4 copies in the office that can be checked out for a week at a time and that the company has asked that no copies be made.

Old Business:

- Mary Mohrhauser, block 9, lots 18-20 was not here, so her motion is dropped.
- Bob Stender, block 1, lots 84-85 is here and he read his motion regarding disrespecting the American flag and it carried.
- Mary Francis appreciated and thanked the Association for the card and plant sent to her after surgery.
- Rod and Maralene Klein said that Ed Tallman will be available if anyone needs any stuff hauled. Contact them to get ahold of him.

INTERNET:

- OnaWave is a company out of Onawa, IA and Wi-Fi is in the office, free of charge, for all 12 months of the year. Yes, it's \$0.00 if we allow them tower space.
- Bill from OnaWave said that he won't be satisfied until every single camper who WANTS internet access has it. WHEN it is all up and working, everyone in the park will have it free for a week.

Old Business continued:

- He has waived the \$50.00 initial hook-up fee and the price will be \$36.00 a month.
- Coast to Coast or off the road campers will be able to pay daily or weekly, hopefully by credit cards or debit cards soon.
- Harp, block 7, asked about the electricity to run it.
- Joni Kelso is the contact person regarding OnaWave.
- If you interested in NOT having your newsletter mailed to your home and instead reading it on the Internet, please sign up for it in the office.
- Rod Klein, block 6, lots 26-27, said if may affect our bulk rate, for it we need 200 pieces of mail.
- David Bartlett, block 12, lots 29-32 did research on having electric meters at each lot or in the case of owning multiple lots in a row, being able to combine into one meter.
- The company is Bryanlabs.Com.
- Coast to Coast and KOA camps have them. Kat Wiley, block 15, said that in Texas, they have a meter outside their door. Every lot is separate.
- David said that in the last 5 years, our electricity bills have averaged \$67-75,000.00. A friend of his says on an average 3 nights a week running an electric heater or a/c as needed, his friend pays \$15.00 a month for the electric.
- Everyone would pay for what THEY use.

Old Business continued:

- Those that live here, would pay more than those who are here less often.
- He would like to see a flat rate on our lots.
- His example was 1,400 lots at \$200.00 each would be \$280,000., with everyone paying his/her own electric bill.
- He said we would save \$40-50,000 a year for future repairs. A licensed electrician would need to hook up each meter@ a cost of \$50-60 each and they cost \$140.00 for each meter.
- Discussion followed.
- Anyone wanting more information, contact David.
- Kevin said that they copy machine was replaced over the winter and that we have a new one in the office.
- From now on, the 480 newsletters will be printed at the office, instead of taking them to an Omaha company.
- The service contract is \$35.00 a month through Counsel (formerly Bros. Brothers) out of Harlan, IA. The service contract is for 1,000 copies for the office & anyone to use a month.
- After this first year, the price of the copy machine & service contract, we will break even and from then on, we'll be ahead.
- It costs \$275.00 a month to print the 480 newsletters. Lois Hollerup, block 7, lot 42 asked how much it cost. \$1,400
- Tammy Croson, block 4, lot 85 asked if it was a fax machine, too and was told yes, it is.

- Marilyn Garnett asked how much it is to make a copy. Kevin told it costs 1.9 cents per copy and we will charge 5 cents a copy and faxes are \$1.00 a page.
- Volunteers are still needed for the clubhouse bathrooms to stain the wood to prevent rot.
- Rod Klein volunteered.

Destruction of Property:

- A teenager driving a go-cart tore up the main road, across from the pool.
- FIVE different Association members tried to get the young man to stop. Finally, with the 5th member asking him to stop, he stopped.
- Kevin had looked up and as of June 2003, there is a \$100.00 fine that can be accessed for destruction of property.
- Kevin asked what we should do. Mike Nelson, block 5, lot 15 asked why access a fine? Kevin then told that the father was behind the teenager and saw the 5 different Association members ask him to stop and did nothing. \$100.00 fine will be accessed.
- THANKS to Katherine Oliver, block 1, lots 4-6, for finding a nice price on the rock that is cheaper, but not cheap, with very little dust.
- Two loads have been put on the roads and they sure look nice!
- Maralene Klein, block 3, lots 26-27, said that she really needs help with activities this year. She said that Gloria Delanty, block 15, lot 62-65 will be doing Bingo games in the clubhouse.

- Bicycles under 21” need a flag too!

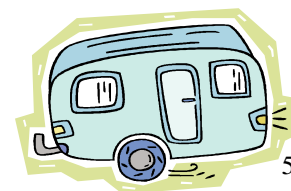
Thank You!

The small flags marking each tree in Memorial Park were donated by Tammy and Kenny Croson in memory of Marian Croson, Kenny's mother.

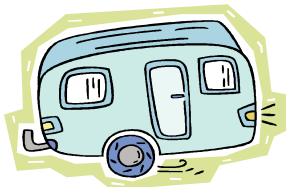
