IMPORTANT REMINDER

According to the Department of Natural Resources, (DNR), and the Environmental Protection Agency, (EPA), rules we are not allowed to burn anything except yard waste in the burn pit. We are also under the rules of the DNR and the EPA when it comes to dumping our household trash. That means that we are not to put anything except household waste in the trash receptacles which are provided by the contracted waste removal company. The waste removal company has warned us that they will terminate or contract, for the last time, if we continue to put illegal trash in the receptacles. If they get caught dumping illegal trash, in the land fill, they are the one who gets the fine.

The Covenants, and By-Laws, are what governs the Campground. This is a friendly reminder that perhaps it is time for everyone to take a few minutes to read our Covenants and By-Laws. 
